



AgCAREERSTART IS A 10-12 MONTH GAP-YEAR PROGRAM TO KICK-START YOUNG AUSTRALIANS' CAREERS IN AGRICULTURE.

This unique gap-year program provides you with a paid job, training and development, not to mention the opportunity to build your networks within the agriculture industry.

You can identify the type of farm and location that you would prefer to be placed in. A matching process is undertaken to ensure participants are assigned to the type of farms that match your interests and skills.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO APPLY?

- Anyone aged from 17-25 can apply
- Must be legally able to work in Australia
- Driver's license preferred
- Previous experience in agriculture not required, but welcome

WHAT'S IN IT FOR ME?

- Full-time paid farm job with a passionate host farmer
- A \$4,500 Training and Engagement Bursary to upskill yourself
- Funding to travel to industry events
- A dedicated support team
- A network of peers across the country



BENJAMIN | 2022 PARTICIPANT

Placement Industry: Dairy

Location: Shepparton, Victoria



Benjamin had always wanted to get a job in agriculture, but being from Brisbane and having no experience, he found it hard getting a foot in the door. It was important to Benjamin to find the right placement because of his disability, and he was matched with his host farmer, Mandy, who offered him a position as a Dairy Hand. Benjamin was able to perform a lot of different roles in the dairy, from milking to calf rearing, and droving. Benjamin has made the most of his Training and Engagement Bursary, travelling to Sydney and Melbourne with the program to attend conferences and training opportunities, where he has made great friends with some of the other participants in his cohort. After AgCAREERSTART, Benjamin is staying on the dairy farm and will be undertaking a year-long dairy traineeship, looking to learn even more skills to put him on the road to one day owning his own farm.



WHAT CAN YOU EXPECT TO GET OUT OF THE PROGRAM?

Get paid to learn

AgCAREERSTART is a unique pathway into agriculture, enabling you to get paid while you learn. Every day of your gap-year will offer exciting challenges and opportunities to grow. On top of the skills and experience you will gain working on the farm, you will undertake farm safety training and gain access to a Training and Engagement Bursary to upskill yourself throughout your placement.

A new network

The program provides you with access to a network of like-minded young people also embarking on their gap-years. There will be many opportunities to build your networks and attend significant industry events, such as conferences, agricultural field days, and other local events, utilising your Training and Engagement Bursary.

Ongoing support

We know that starting a new job and moving away from home can be daunting, so the AgCAREERSTART team will provide you with ongoing support to ensure a safe and rewarding experience and the assistance to move into a career in agriculture at the completion of your placement.

FAQs

Where will I be placed?



During the application process you will be asked whether you would like to relocate interstate, or whether you are happier staying closer to home. When we are matching you with a farm, we take into consideration your location preference and industry preferences and try to match you to an appropriate farm.

Is AgCAREERSTART open to people of all abilities?



Yes, please let us know if you have any specific needs so that we can appropriately match you with the right host farm.

Do I get accommodation?



This is farm dependent – many farmers will provide accommodation, however in some cases you may have to find your own accommodation. You can elect whether or not you are happy to find your own accommodation during the application process.

Do I get paid?



Yes, the AgCAREERSTART program is an on-farm working gap year. Rates of pay will depend on the type of farm, the role, and your experience, but all pay rates will be in accordance with the appropriate Award.

LUCY | 2022 PARTICIPANT

Placement Industry: Horticulture
Location: Adelaide River, Northern Territory



Lucy grew up hearing stories of the North that sparked her desire to experience it for herself, but wasn't sure how to align her passion for the environment with a role in the Top End. Through AgCAREERSTART, Lucy was matched with host farmer, Bruce, who employed Lucy in a conservation management role on his station. Moving all the way from Adelaide, Lucy worked with Bruce in their lemon orchard and further afield on the station managing the natural rangelands on the property. Lucy enjoyed the social side of working on a large station and spent weekends by the river with her colleagues – watching out for crocodiles of course! After her gap-year, Lucy is off to study a double degree in Agriculture and Business, with hopes of one day finding a role in the cattle industry with the focus on combating climate change.

Will I get to meet other participants?

Yes! You will be connected with other participants in your area and be added to a national network of AgCAREERSTART participants.



I already have farm experience, can I still participate?

Yes! AgCAREERSTART is for anyone wanting to work on a farm, whether you have tonnes of experience, or none. If you have worked on a farm before, AgCAREERSTART can help to find you the next role in your agricultural journey, whilst supporting you to gain further training opportunities and experience a different farm, industry, or location.



Do I need my own car/driver's license?

A driver's license is highly recommended. Farms are geographically spread out and, in most cases, will not be near public transport or close to townships. This will mean that you will need a driver's license and, in many cases, your own vehicle (some farms may offer use of a vehicle, but this is farm dependent).



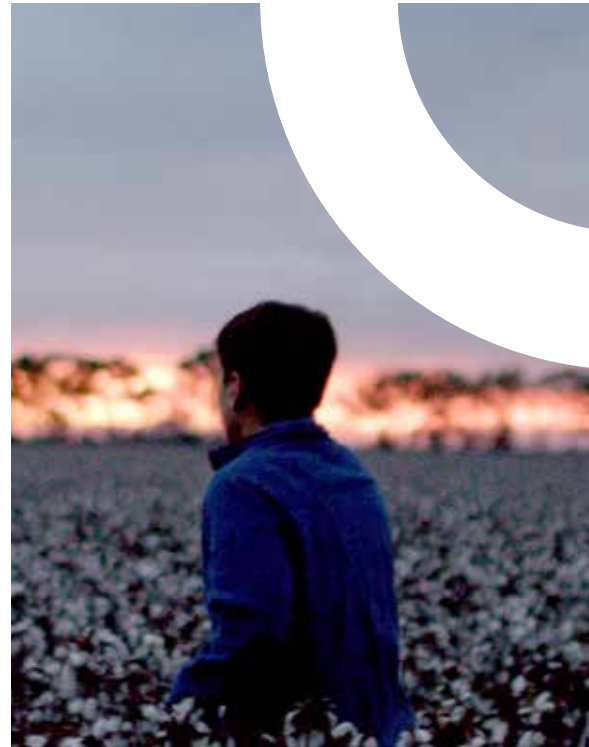
What kinds of farm placements are there?

We have a range of farming placements available, ranging from outback cattle stations to inner-city vertical farms, to fruit growers to dairy farms. The world is your oyster! Check out our handy industry guide for the kinds of placements we have had in the past.

APPLICATION STEPS

You've decided you're ready to start your gap-year in agriculture. Here's how the AgCAREERSTART application process works.

1. Head to the application page on the website to download a practice application.
2. Prepare your 800-word written statement OR a 5-minute video telling us why you'd like to do a gap-year on an Australian farm and why we should select you.
3. Prepare a resumé to submit with your application that tells us about your work history, your education, key skills, and any extra-curricular activities.
4. Send the AgCAREERSTART Reference Template to your character referee
Note: your referee must not be related to you.
5. Submit your application via the AgCAREERSTART website, before the deadline.
6. Sit tight! The AgCAREERSTART team will process your application and let you know if you have been shortlisted by Friday 20th October, 2023.
7. The AgCAREERSTART team will commence matching shortlisted applicants and you will be notified of the outcome via email.
8. If you are matched with a host farm, you will be invited to attend an interview; online or in person.
9. Pending the outcome of your interview*, you will be offered a placement on-farm for 2024. At this stage, you will also select a start date with your host farmer.
10. Pack up your things, and head to farm to start your AgCAREERSTART placement!



*In the case of an unsuccessful interview, your application will re-enter the matching process and you may be matched with another host farm. AgCAREERSTART is a competitive program and not all applicants will be successful in securing a placement. Applicants who demonstrate enthusiasm and responsiveness will be given preference.

GAVIN | HOST FARMER

Placement Industry: Cotton and Grain

Location: Griffith, New South Wales



Host farmer Gavin came to the AgCAREERSTART program looking to build his workforce on farm, and provide an opportunity for a young person to get started in the industry. Gavin was searching for someone who wanted to learn about cotton and the vast array of technology that he uses on farm. Gavin's participant, Julian, moved from Canberra and was able to experience the full scope of the cotton season, all the way from planting to picking. From the day he started, Julian was operating multi-million-dollar pieces of machinery, and Gavin even had him capturing and analysing farm data using sophisticated software programs. Like many of our host farmers, Gavin believes that it's more important that young people are keen and enthusiastic than whether or not they have a lot of experience.
